"בּצֵדֶק וּבְמִשְׁפֵּט with righteousness and with justice




Help us all to have compassion for one a:

"To me, this is the heart of doikayt (hereness), the idea of rooting and fighting in all the messy history of where we really are"



Save them, the children of this place,


Gaza the most beautiful, and Gaza the damned.


